The Fon people of Benin believe in the creator god of twin powers, known as Mawu-Lisa. Lisa, the male twin, is considered the god of the sun, and controls the day. The ruler of the world's power and strength, Lisa is associated with the sun, war, hard work and warmer temperatures. In some cultures, the sky gods are also regarded as the parents of seven other twin gods; earth, storm, iron, water, air, birds and beasts.



Headwear: Lisa, Fon god of the sun, wears a sun headdress, which represents daylight, warmth and power.

Body: Lisa, the Fon sun god, wears a suit of armor and iron-crafted crescent tool symbolize a youthful, warrior spirit, that is strong, adept, hardworking and productive. He inspires people with courage, creativity and ingenuity.

Legs: These are the legs of the Fon sun god, Lisa.

FACT: The Fon people of the Benin region of Africa believe Lisa, gifted with power, strength and the help of his twin sister Mawu, created the universe.
